Jerry's bike was OK, but mine suffered significant damage. I was shaken but not injured. We got it up and running and I made it home, but black ice still lurks in my memory.

So when someone suggests a winter ride I stay off side roads, especially if there has been recent snow. I monitor the temperature and I am extremely wary of shady roads. Call it wisdom if you will. Perhaps it is just prudence. Or maybe a survival instinct.

Children's Hospital Ride – December 9th

RD Swanson and Don Eilenberger (Trustees) -NJ Shore BMW Riders For over ten years the three NJ BMW (New Jersey Shore BMW Riders, Skylands BMW Riders and New Sweden BMW Riders) clubs have sponsored a December event to benefit the Children's Specialized Hospital in Toms River, N.I.

It has become a tradition that each year the clubs meet to share coffee and donuts and renew friendships before riding as a group to the hospital to deliver toys and checks. Working closely with the staff of the hospital, these contributions have been used over the years to purchase computers, TVs, DVD players and the like for the children's use in rehabilitation therapy. The toys are distributed to the children and their families to help spread the joy of the season. This year the three clubs and members donated over \$1,000 to be used for new computer equipment for rehabilitation of handicapped children.

The attendance varies with the weather - but the event has never been canceled despite snow, rain or freezing temperatures. This year we were lucky enough to have a not too cold day.

Riders left their warm homes to head for the gathering place (the parking lot of a state Motor Vehicle Inspection Station not far from the hospital.) There they found friends from all three clubs (and some coffee and donuts to warm up with.) After chatting (and telling lies, kicking tires) 20 bikes took off for the hospital - where approximately 30 people from the clubs got to visit with the staff and children.



At the hospital the pile of toys built up as member after member contributed their small bit to the worthwhile event. The members then went to visit with some of the resident children, and help them in their wheelchairs out to the parking lot to see the motorcycles. The smiles on both members and children's faces demonstrated the

value of this annual event. A short ride after the event to a local restaurant (Charlie Brown's) for lunch rounded out what was a great day, on the way home the temperature rose to over 40F.



More on the hospital: Children's Specialized Hospital, is the largest pediatric rehabilitation hospital in the nation with nine centers across NJ. The Toms River location serves the central and shore areas of NJ, providing service, both inpatient and outpatient to children from birth to age 21. They provide rehabilitation care for children affected by traumatic brain injury, spinal cord dysfunction and injury, premature birth, autism, developmental delays, and life-changing illnesses. 

Annual Mileage Contest Stats – Presented at our annual Holiday Party!

Roger Trendowski once again kept track of our bikes and miles, and created fine certificates suitable for framing for all members who participated in the annual club mileage contest. The contest runs yearly from December 1st to November 30th - giving members a full year to count miles not counted in the MOA mileage contest. Here are the results for the 2012 contest:

- ➤ 1st Place: Alex Edly, riding a 2002 Black K1200RS 18,172 miles and a Blue K1200RS 1,896 miles for a total of 20,068 miles.Most consistent top mileage performer; In top 3 for 4 yrs
- 2nd Place: George Szatmari riding a K100RT, 11,595 miles total Half as much Award (Last year he did double this mileage for 1st place.)
- 3rd Place: Don Eilenberger 2007 R1200R 11,231 miles total. Road Captaining Helps!; Moved from 9th place last year to 3rd (+6 position improvement)
- 4th Place: Jimmy McFadden R1200GS 10,956 Miles. High miles without an External Catheter.
- > 5th Place: Bill Dudley R90S 1975 3,477 miles, 1971 Moto Guzzi Ambassador 3,248 miles, R80RT 3,834 miles for 10,559 total miles! Biggest gainer from last year +10 positions from 15th place on OLD bikes.
- 6th Place: Roger Trendowski on a 04 R1150GS Adv 6,072 miles, and an 81 R100RT 1,422 Miles and a 92 R100GS 1,100 miles. For a total of 8,594 miles. Consistency Award! Roger has gotten 6th place 3 years running.

- 7th Place: Grant Duncan on his 1998 R1100R 194 miles and his R1200GS 6,785 miles for a total of 6,979 miles. Stuck in place; 7th place 4 yrs in a row.
- 8th Place: Joe Karol on his R1200RT 5,171 miles, on his Kawasaki KLR650 1,664 miles for a total of 6,835. Most inconsistent award; 8th, 5th, 10th, 6th, 3rd,7th then 5th. Joe hasn't found a place he ;likes yet.
- 9th Place: Dan Thompson on his 2004. R1150rt 3,870 miles, and on his 2010. K1300GT 2182 miles. Total 6,052 miles. Two bikes didn't help.
- ▶ 10th Place: Mike Lamberti on his R1200GS 4,433 miles total. Too much commuting, not enough touring.
- ▶ 11th Place: Dave Rosen on his 1993 K75RT 3,906 total. Nosedive award. 3rd place 2010 to 8th place in 2011 to 11th place this year.
- 12th Place: Greg Wright 2009 R1200R 3,567 miles total. Better insurance rates for few miles?
- ➤ 13th Place: Dennis Swanson R1200R 3,426 total miles. 12 more years until 1st place. Dennis is slowly moving up:15th place to 14th to 13th... at this rate in 12 more years he'll be in 1st place
- 14th Place: Kenton Seydell k100rt 2,926 miles total. Most miles with (leaning) sidecar
- ➤ 15th Place: John Malaska R1200R 952 miles total. Over the Physical Cliff. Top 3 last year to bottom 3 this year
- 16th Place: Jim Thomasey on his Suzuki Vstrom 650 Adv 900 miles. What's a VStrom? What's a Suzuki?
- 17th Place: Mike Kowal on his R1200C Cruiser 320 miles, on his R100/7 18 miles. For a total of 338 miles. 18 miles in a driveway? At least it is not negative miles this year.
