President's Message:

It's actually cold out there this month, and we've had a tiny dusting of snow, so Winter is effectively on us. But despair not, for we live in Central New Jersey, and we'll have plenty of rideable days this Winter. Just yesterday (Nov 30) it was up into the 50's, and today, it was already over 50 when I got up at 8AM. Rain predicted for today, but the radar shows the rain to be hours and hours west of here, and my wife, bless her, suggests we get on the bike and go for a ride. All of which is to say that there's no need to winterize your bike and put it on blocks; just get some heated gear and carry on through the winter.


Of course, if you live north of the Raritan River, you're screwed. Put chains on your moto or put it on blocks.

For those of you who do park it for the winter, there have been discussions on some of the online groups about long term storage of gasoline in your bike (like over the winter). Some are in favor of draining the gasoline out of the system, so that the ethanol doesn't have a chance to attack the rubber parts, and so that water in the gas doesn't separate out and rust out the bottom of the tank (assuming a steel tank). There's also been a long discussion about removing the ethanol from the gas, which is not as difficult as you'd imagine.

The trick is to add a few percent (by volume) water to your gasoline, and then mix thoroughly. The ethanol will mix with the water, and the water won't mix with the gas, so you end up with a clear "water and ethanol" component, and above that, the pure gasoline. Then you drain out the water (from the bottom of the tank). If you drain through a clear hose, you can see the transition between the water and the gasoline. Motorcycle Consumer News published an article on this about a year ago.

Ride it or park it, I hope to see you all at the Holiday/Xmas/Hanukkah/Kwanza Party on December 13, and the Toy Run/Childrens' Hospital visit on December 14.


Wind and the Tough Brisket
