OK, I got a little excited last month, Spring is not almost here. I've got 50 yards of ice and snow from the garage to the street, and it was 15 out this morning. Ugh.



Gear Review - Freeze-Out Long Johns from Cycle Gear

I've been looking at different winter gear combinations for my legs. I purchased a used set of heated gear but the heated Widder chaps were size 29 so I never used these (I never looked at the chaps until a year after I bought them).

I sometimes used military Goretex over-pants that were great at blocking the wind and keeping me warm but my wife told me I looked "conflicted" for wearing camouflage pants and a hiviz vest.

I tried wearing fleece sweatpants under my

mesh pants and that works to about 40 degrees then it starts getting chilly quickly below that. I wanted to get non-mesh pants or I could try Freeze-Out long johns that I've been seeing on perpetual 65% off sale at Cycle Gear. At \$25, I figure the cost of failure is low but the return on investment would be great if it works.

So I bought a set and tested them. I went out on a ride were the temperatures ranged from 33 down to 27 degrees. The conditions were sunny and dry.



As I was trying to consciously assess the long johns, my mind eventually wandered and just got on with the ride. When I stopped, I realized that I had been pretty comfortable. The F-O long johns blocked most of the wind and the fleece-like interior provided very good insulation. I would say the sensation was like wearing shorts in the low to mid-50s, cool but far from cold.

Worn under non-mesh pants, I imagine these would perform even better. It's relatively thin so it is much less bulky than the quilted thermal liners found in most motorcycle pants. The quality

of the materials is pretty good.

I wear a 36x30 pants and bought the size large. The inseam length was generous, maybe good to 32 inches. It is a bit stretchy. The rise on the waist seems low and the fit is not tailored like a Saville Row suit but it is comfortable underwear that delivers on its promises.

The one drawback is that it is not waterproof.

I would give it a solid recommendation specially when the price is factored in.
