Some models have ABS brakes, traction control and heated grips. Horsepower seems to run around 65, but there are models with more horses. The price rises with the greater horsepower and the options.

Being the loyal BMW rider I made the suggestion we take a look at the new R Nine t Scrambler and so we headed upstairs to see Maire and the bike. It's a beauty! Slightly different than the standard model, it has tubeless tires, a more upright riding position, different mufflers, slightly higher seat height, different instrument cluster, options on spoke or non-spoke wheels, and different tires. There are other cosmetic changes, but it is still an R Nine T.

Being there I had to buy something so looked at the helmets, gloves and boots. All were marked down. I bought a nice pair of BMW leather and Goretex gloves. Reduced by the 15% and by points I had acquired with the dealer, they were a reasonable purchase. I used them two days later and they were quite nice.
