


Tthe fellow I bought the C650GT from in August, Tim Spenard has given up completely on riding.

Club Movie Night - Jan 23

We had our annual club movie night on January 23rd, once again graciously hosted by Crown Engineering. Pizza and soda was ordered (and paid for out of the club Treasury) and consumed. We watched two different videos, which could not have been more different from one another, though they both involved motorcycling.

The first video was one episode of Season 1 of a show on AMC (cable network) called

"Ride with Norman Reedus".

In each episode, Norman, who has starred in various TV shows (most notably "The Walking Dead"), invites someone else who is famous to ride along with him, and they go somewhere "interesting".

In Episode 1, for example, Norman (on an R9T) and a woman jewelry designer ride up California Highway 1, the Pacific Coast Highway, sampling some tourist spots along the way.

In the episode we watched, Norman invited Peter Fonda, of "Easy Rider" fame, to ride with him from the Gulf Coast of Florida to Key West. This was clearly not a "get your knee down" kind of ride, as most of the roads in Florida are dead straight. Peter Fonda is still an active motorcyclist at age 78, he was riding a (modern) Triumph cruiser and Norman was riding a (modern) Triumph Tiger.

The second video we watched was a movie from 1957, "I Fidanzati della Morte", or "Engaged to Death".

This is a movie about racing in Italy, and the plot can be characterized as "soap opera".

Regardless, it was an interesting picture of racing (and living) in Italy over 60 years ago. The picture had English subtitles so we could follow along. The video itself was the product of an extensive restoration, carried out in 2017. The restoration was paid for via a "kickstarter", which is an internet fund-raiser. I contributed to the kickstarter, for which I received a copy of the DVD of the restored movie.

All attendees but Joe were in their cars; Joe braved the (not super) cold to ride his BMW to the event.
