MOA Upcoming Rides

Spring is a great time to start serious riding again....not only around here but longer dis-

tances. I enjoy the MOA rallies including geta-way rallies and National Rally. A few of us have already registered for MOA Rallies in April and June. The first get-a-way is in Fontana NC, April 22-24. The "Tail of the Dragon" in the Great Smoky Mountains brags 318 turns in 11 miles... Excellent ride especially in early morning before the police patrols are out. It's a hotel-based event hosted at Fontana Village; two meals and door prize drawings are included with the MOA fee. Hotel is extra reservation. The Rally is close to the Dragon, Cherohala Skyway, and many other great riding near Robbinsville, Cherokee and the Blue Ridge Parkway. What is nice about this destination is the ride to/ from it. Last year five of us headed down a zig-zag route into the New River Gorge in WV, rode up the iced tree-line Mount Mitchell near Ashville, toured through Wheels-thru-Time Museum in Maggie Valley (4th time over the years), and then of course rode the Dragon and Cherohala Highways. This year after the rally I hope to go down to Birmingham, AL to see Barbers MC Museum.

The MOA National Rally is in Springfield, MO on June 16-19. As always, there will be over 100 MC vendors, seminars, bike/riding training sessions, plenty of food and entertainment. All is being held in the Fair Grounds which MOA rents for the week. Of course the key event for Joe K and me is volunteering to run the Peoples Choice Bike Judging/Show held on Saturday. This is where 40-50 bikes are arranged in 10 classes. Rally goers vote for the best bike per class. See

I'm still planning the routes down and back but am looking at the Corvette Museum in Bowling Green KT, and possibly Greenbrier (WV) the bunker that "Congress never used."

MOA registration slots are filling up for the get-a-ways but hotel reservations may be harder to get unless you want to share. The

get-a-ways are usually capped at 150 attendees. There is no registration limit for the National Rally. Typically 5000 attend. Camping is included and there are numerous hotels in Springfield. The MOA has many other get-aways scheduled for 2022... some in the east, one in Canada, and others much further west. Asphalt/Dirt Ride on 3/16

I saw a Skylands BMW Club ride scheduled for Wednesday 3/16. It was advertised as an asphalt/dirt ride by Walter Barlow, an avid Skylands ride leader. Skylands runs at least one ride per week if the weather is good enough. On Wednesday 3/16 the weather was great (60's, blue sky). Walter loves offroad (dirt road) rides but has occasionally given-in to lead a mixed asphalt/dirt route at the pleading of his club mates. He rides a KTM with knobbies with almost all the accessories removed. His bike doesn't have a panniers, or tank bag... just the basics (short windshield and an old GPS with wired earphones) to keep weight to a minimum. It's perfect for off road.

I showed up at Jerry's Brooklyn Deli in Whitehouse Station NJ (off of Rt 22) at 11 to eat and ready to ride to noon. This is a nice place for a meal any time of the day... breakfast to dinner... plenty of seating and breakfast bar. We traveled less than 3 miles on asphalt before we hit the first dirt road. Most of the dirt roads were mild gravel with no mud or sand like we have in South Jersey. I've been on other rides with Walter with non-GS

bikes riding with ease on these roads. I was amazed at how many secondary and dirt roads there are in this area. There were also beautiful homes built way out in the boondocks too. We must have re-routed a half dozen times from Walter's original GPS route due to "bridge construction." Of course we tried going past the barricades to see if we could by-pass the construction ... no way ... as you can see in the picture below. Overall I put on 145 miles from Middletown. It took 50 minutes to reach Walter at the starting point, then another hour and guarter to ride home. We spent only a couple hours riding the back roads before I headed for home up Rt 202, Rt287 and GSP. You can see my short video at: https://youtu.be/KoEb HxT-xk

Asphalt/Dirt Ride, version 2

The 3/16 asphalt/dirt roads were so good that I decided to do them again. So on Tuesday 3/22, Joe K and I headed to White House Station to begin Walter Barlow's route; Joe on his single cylinder (off road thumper, 1999 Kawasaki KLR 650) and me on my F850GSA. We hit the same dirt and very secondary (one lane) asphalt roads to Frenchtown where we ate at Bridge Street Café. This café overlooks the Delaware and the narrow metal bridge that connects PA with NJ. By the way, our first food break stops at Sky Manor

Airport and French Town Café were futile as they were closed on Tuesday. (I think both are run by the same folks.) From Frenchtown, we headed to the shore via Rt 29 to Trenton and then I195 rather than finish the original dirt/asphalt route from the previous week. I put on 184 miles on this ride.

Element E50 Fire Extinguisher

Recent chit chat on one of the Airheads BMW mailing lists discussed gasoline fires and how they can ruin your day. Even new bikes are susceptible to this – remember the plastic quick disconnect gas lines on recent BMWs? (That Mike Kowal replaces with metal ones?)

One product which was suggested is a fire extinguisher that looks and works like a road flare, in that you strike the tip with the cap to ignite it. It then emits a jet of fire-retardant magic smoke for about 50 seconds (in the case of the mid-sized version). For reference, a nominal 5lb ABC extinguisher (which weighs about 7.5lb) is good for about 15 seconds of use.

The Element E50, being "solid state", has no gas or liquid to pressurize, so it will last practically forever. Since it's the size of a road flare, it will fit in a tank bag or perhaps even under the seat.

The drawback of these is that they are nonrefillable – once you fire it off, you get 50 seconds of magic smoke, and then you throw it out. The 50 second model sells for around \$75.
