

Mid-week Ride to Long Valley

On the spur of the moment, on March 11th, I took a ride with the Skylands Sport Touring Club (previously Skylands BMW Riders). I woke up early, as usual ,on Tuesday morning, about 6am... The day looked great... upper 50's, sunny, no chance of rain. Ginna said, "why don't you go riding?". I remembered that the Skylands guys almost always have a Tuesday or Wednesday ride (which retiree's seem to like vs. weekend rides). Since I am also a member of Skylands, I searched last week's emails to find the details.

The ride KSU was at 10:15am but it's an hour and 15 minutes away on Rt.22 in Branchburg. So by 9am I was suited up, checked my bike (yep, still there) antook off. The traffic on I-287 surprised me in that the were two significant slow-downs at that time of the morning. I stopped for gas just before the Quick-Check convenience store starting point.

I was one of 14 members starting the route. The group was so large the ride leader broke us down into two groups. I went with the first group which I suspect was the "fast" group. In any case, the route was only "asphalt" roads but with some of them being a little more than one lane wide. The mid -week Skylands rides tend to be in the central/western part of NJ, sometimes North Jersey and sometimes into PA. This route was no exception. It zig-zagged below Rt 22, then north of Rt 22, ending up in Long Valley which is near Chester.

I didn't stay for lunch, but they found La Rienda Latin restaurant which advertised great tacos. I was exhausted by the end of the ride, primarily because of all the twists and turns and accelerations/decelerations. The ride home via interstate actually felt relaxing at higher speed with no turns. The total route from my home in Middletown, including the Ride Route was 185 miles, 6 hrs. BDR film at Cross Country BMW

If this article sounds like the one last year and the year before,... it is, basically because I used the general front-end and added the specifics for this year's BDR.



Southeast BDR Route, introduced March 2025. Starts on Gulf/Fla Panhandle and continues to NC Maggie Valley.

The BDR, for those not familiar, is the Backcountry Discovery Routes organization. It is an adventure-based group that creates outstanding off-road rides all over the United States. BDR is a non-profit organization like MOA, RA, Airheads and most local clubs. Their rides start with months, if not years of research on the best route from point to point within a region. In the past they've created, videoed and published routes in WA, CO, IA, NV, UT, AZ, NM, MA (mid Atlantic, several states), CA (south), NE (North East), WY, OR, and Northern California.



They hit a lot of water along the way... some very deep and long stretches.

This year's route being rolled out at Dealers is in the Southeast US, starting at the Gulf of "X" and going North. Their routes cross public roads and lands (not private property) and over paved and dirt roads. Many of their routes are on mountainous fire roads, rough dirt roads and trails. The routes, downloadable for your GPS and phone, also identify "expert" rough terrain/trails.



As BDR's videos show, usually 7-10 riders do the ride for video purposes. The films are EXCELLENT with professional-looking video and pictures, taken from in-

front, behind, and above (a lot of drone videos). BDR provides a video trailer on their website, full video, free tracks, interactive maps, photos, as well as camping, hotel, food and gas information.



Packing lists, discovery points and FAQs for each route are included. As time goes on, they publish Route Updates to insure the latest information is available. Most of the BDR route videos are now available for free viewing on their website. Just select a route and the video is shown along with GPS tracks, Q&As, and other information. Of course there are many BDR things that you can buy as well as a monetary way to support them.
